For many of us, the true impact of COVID-19 was felt in March of 2020. During that month, the University System of Georgia

shut down, school systems across Georgia switched to virtual learning, restaurants and business shut down. We all watched the news as the numbers crept up. Some of us wept, all of us prayed. We had no idea that the impact of the COVID-19 virus would be felt all over the world, a year later, and even longer.

During this time, there are many lessons that we have learned as we have adjusted to this "new normal." These lessons are evident on a daily basis even as we hear more about vaccinations and get back to fellowshipping.

1. We are resilient. 2 Timothy 1:7-For God has not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind. We have truly found strength and faith during this time, even when we did not see an end in sight. We found new ways to communicate with our foster parents, children in care, stakeholders, church family and more. We learned that Zoom is not only a verb, but a proper noun. We somehow became used to holding meetings and trainings virtually and seeing everyone in the small rectangles of our computer screens. We even held virtual fundraising events where our supporters were so instrumental in us meeting our goals.

2. The need is even greater. James 1:27—Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this, to visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to



keep himself unspotted from the world. This is a verse that is often used as the reason behind the work that we do. During the time of the pandemic, we saw that there was an even greater need to provide safe, loving homes for children who experienced abuse and neglect. Children were now in the home 24/7 with those adults who were unable or unwilling to care for them. Children were removed from schools where they had access to mandated reporters who were required to report any signs of abuse and neglect that they witnessed. On a daily basis, we received those referrals for children who experience this in families that were meant to keep them safe.

3. Our foster parents are awesome! John 15:13—*Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends.* Not literally, but our foster parents have made new sacrifices to serve children and families over this past year. Not only have they had to support their children through this pandemic, they have also had to fearlessly open their doors to children and youth taken into foster care. At a time when many do not wish to add stressors to their lives, our foster parents said otherwise and recognized that these children and youth still deserved to live in a home free from harm, abuse and neglect.

4. Our children need you. We are still in need of foster parents. We are still in need of families who are willing to open their hearts and homes to children and youth. Every time we have to turn down a placement, it is heartbreaking. Our overall goal is growth, but this growth encompasses more than just numbers. It is touching the hearts of children and youth in foster care and making a true impact on their lives.

Calvin Brown, Jr. and Dr. Joi Brown have been foster parents since 2019. They live in DeKalb County with their two-year-old daughter, Amari, and they attend Avondale Church of Christ. Calvin's parents, Calvin Brown, Sr. and Donna Brown, have been Agape foster parents for 17 years!

What first inspired you to become foster parents?

Calvin: Seeing the influence my parents had on the lives of so many children that came through our home while growing up. I wanted to continue my parent's legacy of helping others in need, witnessing first-hand the power of love and care.

What do you think is the most rewarding aspect of being a foster parent? **Joi:** The fun, laughter, and joy that taking care of children will bring.

What do you think is the most challenging aspect of being a foster parent? Joi: Time management and balancing time for yourself and time for the children. As a couple, we both pitch in to help where needed, so we don't get overwhelmed. We plan out our days and activities to be more productive.

What is a funny story or highlight that you've experienced as foster parents?

Joi: Upon finishing training in order to become licensed foster parents, we found out that we were pregnant! Although we would soon be adding to the size of our family, we felt that our hearts were large enough to still open our home to help children in need. God has blessed us tremendously, and we felt there was nothing that could stop us from passing that blessing along by serving others.

What advice would you give to someone who is considering becoming a foster parent? **Calvin**: If you find it in your heart to become a foster parent, do it! If you don't think it is the right time then come back and revisit your situation later. God will prepare you to be ready at the right time.

What is something that surprised you about foster parenting?

Joi: The foster kids actually may call you mom and dad. Although we are not biological parents to them, the fact that they could call us mom or dad warms our hearts and solidifies the fact that we could be that positive beacon of light they need.
