Our work is one answer to the call of pure religion (James 1:27). Together, we can be part of that bridge to the newness

May is recognized and celebrated as National Foster Care Month. In acknowledgement of this annual recognition and time of renewal.

Aysha E. Schomburg, Associate Commissioner of the Children's Bureau, published a message of encouragement and focus for the broader foster care community.

Based on feedback her office received. Ms. Schomburg stated, "... children and youth in foster care, and their caregivers, need us to focus on their mental well-being as diligently as we focus on their physical health and safety."

With this year's theme, Strengthening Minds, Uplifting Families, she went on to say, "an approach that is trauma informed and individualized will consider that each child in a single family may be impacted differently and any plan will be personcentered ... Using a lens of compassion and cultural humility to understand the ways that culture can impact how a person approaches mental health is vital to being able to connect children, youth, and families to the services they need."

At Georgia Agape, we discussed Ms. Schomburg's message with our social services staff. We realize we have an important role as a partner on the journey of exploring the mental health needs of the children and families we serve. We thoroughly agree with and support the commissioner's emphasis on the importance of early assessment and identification of mental health concerns. This is a task we must begin exploring early in foster care. Georgia Agape is well-positioned as a proactive and supportive agency in helping to mitigate mental health struggles before they manifest.

As part of our mission, Agape is committed to doing all we can to help our families and children realize a better and brighter future by ensuring their mental health services are intact or by providing necessary resources for them to obtain these critical services. As Ms. Schomburg concluded, "We have a unique opportunity to be the added support when more is needed."

Over the years as I have written for our Georgia Agape partners, I have shared sources of inspiration to encourage us as we engage in this work of building better and brighter futures for the children who come into our care. Seeing workers on the frontlines of service in the kingdom, practicing true religion as defined in James, is a source of inspiration to me. I don't write about this

much, but observe week after week, the case workers of Georgia Agape standing in the gap for birth parents, foster parents, and the children we serve. They spend hours each week in direct contact with each child, each foster parent, each biological parent, working toward the best resolution for the children entrusted to our care. These tasks intrinsically require care, compassion, and competence. What fires these components begins with a deep spiritual sense of mission I see renewed weekly through the disciplines of devotion: reading of the Word, prayer, and contemplation of the calling each has from Christ. The prayers for each family and the special concerns are offered and the hearts of compassion are filled. The foundation of spirituality in this work has kept these workers going.

I was so impressed by them, in a special way, during the early days of the pandemic when there was so much uncertainty about the virus and how it was to be contained. But complete certainty remained on their part to fulfill the work of attending to these children and their birth and foster parents. On the frontlines, they bravely attended to the routines and requirements of foster care. The office was not physically open, but the work itself continued. The spirit in which it has been done is admirable, and the competence is praiseworthy. With utmost professionalism, Georgia Agape case workers do the work of this agency, in a manner garnering highest marks in their unannounced audits by the Georgia Division of Family and Children Services. As a result, their work over the years has earned Georgia Agape the utmost respect among their peers. They are the driving force behind our agency receiving accreditation by the Certificate of Accreditation (COA), which is internationally recognized for evaluating and recommending industry standards of best practices.

Another source of inspiration to me has been the generous giving by so many. The faithfulness of countless individuals and groups makes it possible to support the staff of Georgia Agape, to provide the training and the practical tools needed to perform the work of foster care. So many of you have been intentional about remembering Georgia Agape's work in all seasons.
