Consider how Michael Jordan characterized his amazing career, "I have missed more than 9,000 shots in my career. I have lost almost 300 games. On 26 occasions I have been entrusted to take the game-winning shot, and I missed. I have failed over and over and over and that is why I succeed."

Think about Babe Ruth. He played 22 seasons for the Yankees, Red Sox, and Braves; had a .342 batting average with 2,873 hits, 714 home runs, 2,214 RBIs and 2,174 runs

scored; won 7 World Series; and was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1936. Guess what? He was struck out 1,330 times in his career.

In a recent article about Steve Wozniak, co-founder of Apple, he reflected on what he plans to have on his mind when facing the end of his life. He won't measure his happiness by the size of Apple's market share or even his personal worth. Instead, he says he will think about the jokes he told and the laughter he shared with family and friends. "These are the moments I want to remember, ... (and) they don't involve co-founding Apple."

People often struggle to find happiness because they see it as a destination. According to Harvard University professor Arthur C. Brooks, "Happiness isn't a destination; it's a direction, ...it has more to do with our inner lives."

I have been blessed to visit with several adults who shared the common experience of being fostered in families working with Georgia Agape. The positive influence of the home where they were placed, the benefit of the training, and the deep love they received helped them see what matters most.

While it's important to develop talents, the inner being is what matters most. Being kind, loving, caring, patient, thoughtful of others matters. It's exciting to learn of significant worldly accomplishments; however, life stories about a person's inner qualities contain lasting impact and can move us to tears.

Sometimes the path is littered with what we consider failures. High anxiety mixes with fear we are not accomplishing our goals. At times like these, we must remember the stories of Babe Ruth and Michael Jordan. Remember how big their failures looked within the context of their sport. Remember how easy it is to misapply failure vs. success on any given day.

Remember we have the power of Creation and the Resurrection filling us and directing us as we strive to live each day. Our foster homes constantly hold up this reality to the children in their care so that one day the children will embrace this power in their inner lives.

Let's reflect daily on the knowledge we can succeed together, at the most important things, one child at a time, fostering hope and changing lives.

Understanding Trauma

State of Georgia Improves Parent Training



The state of Georgia recently introduced new curriculum for foster and adoptive parent training called the National Training and Development Curriculum (NTDC). This new curriculum focuses more on trauma-based initiatives that a potential family caregiver can follow to best help the children in their care.

At Georgia Agape, we applaud the state for recognizing that family caregivers would benefit from more intensive training that aligns with the trauma children in foster care have experienced in addition to basic parenting skills. NTDC requires 30 hours of training and replaces the former foster parent training

known as IMPACT. Per the participant handbook, "The National Training and Development Curriculum (NTDC) is a curriculum based on research and input from experts, families who have experience with fostering or adopting children, and former foster and adoptive youth. It provides potential foster or adoptive parents with the information and tools needed to parent a child who has experienced trauma, separation, and loss. It is a state-of-the-art classroom and online program that helps to prepare prospective foster and adoptive parents to be successful parents. In addition, the NTDC gives caregivers access to information and resources needed to continue building skills once they have a child in their home."

At Agape, we completed our first NTDC training session this spring. We will continue to offer NTDC classes each quarter. The next two sessions will be held July 2-30, 2024, and October 1-31, 2024.
